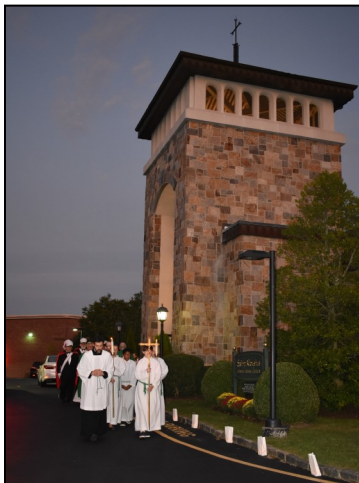

This weekend, the diocesan Pilgrimage Cross is in our parish. This cross, a replica of the World Youth Day Cross given to young people by Pope John Paul II in 1984, is traveling throughout the Diocese of Bridgeport as a reminder to us, especially young people, of our dependence on the cross for our salvation. The replica cross is being carried by Bishop Caggiano on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross in September.

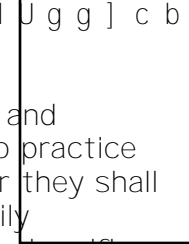
