But it is also a month where we celebrate ordinations and religious vows.

As far as the signs of springtime go, I'm delighted to see everything in bloom. Spring speaks volumes to the renewal that is Easter. Each time I see what God is doing in the splendor of springtime colors, I'm reminded that God is also working in other ways in the world and in our hearts. No matter what we read in the news, God is working on a renewal of souls.

I'm touched by how the construction team has protected the statue over the many months that saw heavy equipment zooming around and dust flying everywhere. I love how Mary is watching over the different chapters of our project. In fact, every few days I gaze out a stairwell window in our parish office building and pray to Mary that she will bless our efforts.

When finishing up our project, we will place that statue of Mary as well as another statue of our Blessed Mother on the new green spaces. In addition, one of our young parishioners will construct a grotto for a statue of Mary in the Holy Spirit Garden (the fenced garden in front of the former church at 40 Maples Street). It is his Eagle Scout Project, and I am so moved by his choice of project – more about this later. Constructed of stone, the grotto will provide a peaceful prayer corner in the garden. Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, our patron, had a great devotion to Mary, and I am confident that Aloysius and Mary, Our Mother will take care of our parish buildings, grounds, and – of course – all of us!
