

# Who Prays Better?

This Sunday's Gospel is the parable of the prayer of the Pharisee and the tax collector. The Pharisees were known to be very devout worshippers of God who were often found at prayer in the temple. Therefore, it would make sense to assume that in the story it will be the Pharisee who will pray "better." But the outcome is a bit of surprise because the tax collector, who, by virtue of his profession, was scorned by society, is the one whose prayer is genuine and humble. The issue here is each man's relationship with God. The Pharisee begins his prayer by thanking God that he is not like other people – not exactly the best start. The tax collector admits to his sinfulness and is grateful for the mercy of God.

Our reading of this parable might find us asking ourselves these questions: How do I speak with God? What is my prayer like? What do I ask of God? What do I say to God in my best moments and in my worst moments?

Prayer is that amazing opportunity for us to have a conversation with the One who is Creator, Redeemer, Advocate, and Sanctifier. If in our prayer we speak from the heart and admit that we rely on God for everything, we are being authentic, and God can surely work with that. If we speak the truth to God about our sin, our fears, our worries, our insecurities, and our joy, God will bless us with forgiveness, peace, confidence, and more joy. If we hold back, we are missing an opportunity to receive God's love spoken to us in His powerful silence. Pray like your life depends on it. Listen with the ear of your heart. Expect great things from God who loves to hear from you!

# Music Notes for 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2025 Dr. John Michniewicz



The readings for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) emphasize the importance of humble prayer over pride, highlighted by the Gospel parable of the tax collector and the Pharisee.

- The opening hymn, "Praise My Soul, the King of Heaven," reflects the theme of God's grace and mercy, drawing connections to the lectionary Psalm 34.
- At the 11:30 AM Mass, the choir will sing "Draw Us In the Spirit's Tether" at the Presentation, connecting to the themes of humility and community prayer found in the readings.
- The Communion Meditation features the anthem Anima Christi (Soul of Christ), a 14th-century Latin prayer set to music by Fr. Marco Frisina, which is a humble plea for God's mercy and salvation.
- The 10:00 AM Family Mass features the spiritual "Guide My Feet" at the Offertory, which aligns with St. Paul's message in the second reading about "finishing the race."
- At the Saturday and early Sunday Masses, the Communion meditation is "Wonderful, Merciful Savior," a contemporary song that serves as a humble prayer for grace and mercy.
