#### **Sundry Summer Thoughts**

This Sunday's first reading is a favorite. Fraught with despair because his journey in life is difficult, Elijah prays for death. And then, as it goes with God in our darkest moments, an angel appears and saves the day – and Elijah. The hearth cake and water jug that he finds are just what he needs to nourish himself, get up, go out, and do what God wants him to do.


I love to go out to eat, but my downfall is the bread that gets plopped down on the table as soon as my order is taken (#freshfromtheovencarbs). To put it simply, when I partake of that bread basket before even seeing my entrée, the party is over before it starts! So here's my metaphorical reflection on all of this: if we stuff ourselves with the "bread" of the world that does not satisfy our deepest desires for true and lasting peace, genuine love, and life-giving relationships, we may feel full, but we will never be satisfied. Saint Augustine said, "Our hearts are restless, O God, until they rest in you!" Jesus said, "The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." What we desire is real food, not the bread of deceiving ourselves into thinking that we're always ok on our own. We are not. We are better with Jesus who continually invites us to eat the Bread of Life so that He can satisfy our hungry hearts and provide the spiritual carb load necessary for us to run the race and feed the world with Good News. Jesus is bread for the world, and thus He binds us together in love, making it possible to do anything that God asks us to do. This is a truth filled with hope. That's why I believe we must continue to invite those who have been away to come to church and the Eucharist and experience truth. unconditional love, and what it's like to never be hungry.

Onto a different topic. I promised I'd write about my gardening adventure. Unfortunately, I don't have a metaphor or spirituallycrafted message for what I thought was going to be a life-giving adventure in God's creation. I don't have anything like that because, to put it simply, the gift I received from gardening was a menacing case of poison ivy. I am done with gardening. However, I did re-learn that patience and trust are a big part of healing. Please know that I understand that for many, gardening is a conduit to God; and to those of you for whom that is true, how blessed you are, and please pray for me as I scratch my way into tomorrow.

Call the Parish Office at least nine months prior to the wedding



We hope that many of you have had the opportunity to register for Religious Education for the upcoming school year. We will begin our class meetings the week of **September 23**<sup>rd</sup>.
