Words from Father Rob Kinnally

God in the Still, Small Voice of the Poor

This Sunday's first reading from the Book of Exodus describes the challenge given to Elijah to be attentive to the Lord's voice. The voice of God is not heard in the strong wind or the rumbling earthquake or in the fire. God's voice is heard in "a tiny, whispering sound." I prefer an older translation that has Elijah hearing the Lord in a "still, small voice." The passage draws us into a wonderful image of God who is not present in the strong and powerful/loud and boisterous realities of our experience, but who is instead speaking softly, perhaps so softly that He could be missed if the listener were not fully attentive.

I also believe that this passage speaks to us about those who have no voice because they are simply powerless. God is present in the still, small voice of those who are at the margins of society, the victims of violence, terrorism, human trafficking, and poverty. If we are not attentive, we will overlook them as we pay more attention to the powerful, strong voices that can overshadow Christ in the streets, Jesus seeking work, God enslaved, or the hungry Son of Man.

Saint Paul urges us to "speak the truth in Christ." That is a mandate not reserved for speech alone but for a way of living. To be true to who we are as Christians means that we use the power we have -- manifest in our intellect, influence, and giftedness -- to give voice to the still, small ones who cannot navigate in the arena of power. To follow Christ faithfully means that we can walk on water (see this Sunday's Gospel) because we are confident believers who don't look down, but keep our eyes fixed on Christ who urges us to walk on water and get everyone into the boat – where all will be safe and sound. May we find our voice in the service of those who have no voice, and may God who is all powerful continue to whisper His desires for us into ears that are truly listening.

God bless you, and don't forget to come to Mass on the great Feast of the Assumption on Tuesday! We need Mary to help us be attentive to her Son's promptings.



Monday, August 28: High School teens needed to take our food donations down to and lend a hand in the Thomas Merton Food Pantry in Bridgeport.



Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Events of August 13-19, 1917

Under the pretext of providing his personal automobile, so that the children could travel safely through the crowds pressing around their homes, the Mayor of Fátima, Artur Santos, (a former Catholic and high Mason), had devised a scheme by which to arrest and interrogate the three children visionaries. When they got into his car, he took the children (alone and without their parents) to the district headquarters some 9 miles away. There he officially arrested the children. He tried bribes, threats of death and locking them in a cell with hardened criminals in order to get them to recant their story. It was to no avail. Despite their ages, their belief in the Lady and their courage as unshakeable.

Meanwhile, in the Cova at noon on the 13th the characteristic external signs (light, clouds and wind) of the Apparition appeared for the benefit of the crowd, (the largest crowd to that time) but because the children were not present, Our Lady did not appear. The crowd dispersed, as yet unaware of the trickery of the mayor.

Because of their arrest Our Lady did not appear to the children on August 13 in the Cova. However, on Sunday the 19th Lucia, her brother John, and Francisco, were grazing the sheep close by to where the Angel had first appeared. At about 4 o'clock, sensing that Our Lady was about to appear, Lucia sent John to fetch Jacinta. As she and Francisco waited they saw the characteristic light. The moment Jacinta arrived the Lady appeared.

"What do you want of me?" Asked Lucia. Come again to the Cova da Iria on the thirteenth of next month, my child, and continue to say the Rosary every day. In the last month I will perform a miracle so that all may believe. "What are we to do with the offerings of money that people leave at the Cova da Iria?" I want you to have two ardors [platforms to carry statues] made, for the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. I want you and Jacinta to carry one of them with two other girls. You will both dress in white. And then I want Francisco, with three boys helping him, to carry the other one. The boys, too, will be dressed in white. What is left over will help towards the construction of a chapel that is to be built here. Lucia then asked for the cure of some sick people. Some I will cure during the year. (looking sadly at them) Pray, pray very much. Make sacrifices for sinners. Many souls go to hell, because no one is willing to help them with sacrifice. Having said that she departed as she had on the other occasions.
