🛚 Words from Father Rob Kinnally

I wish I could talk to every person who is on a search for meaning and purpose in life. I would offer today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah as a "go-to" guide because I believe it contains the answer to these important questions: Who takes care of those who can't take of themselves? Who rescues peoples from darkness and despair? Who offers lasting freedom? Who exercises true justice? How do I thrive in a challenging world?

The questions come from our anxiety about present and future things, our need for a sense of security, and a desire to make a difference – somewhere, somehow. Isaiah proclaims his mission to the exiles returning to Jerusalem after the Babylonian captivity. He paints the picture of a new era of hope. Economic and social injustice will become a thing of the past and all will be restored by the Spirit who will instill a transforming love for those who need it (i.e., everyone).

Fast forward to Luke's gospel (Luke 4:16-20) where Jesus reads these same words of Isaiah and it becomes clear that the answers to those large questions are found in the Lord Jesus himself, the One promised by Isaiah. If we are searching, we are searching for a life with Jesus. If we observe a world that is unfair, we pray that Emmanuel be proclaimed more widely and break into the hearts of those who formulate policy. If we are restless, we are longing for Jesus, the "Dear Desire of Every Nation." If we are "anxious about many things" as Martha was, then we have to find our place this Christmas season at the stable, watching our just and loving God sleeping "in heavenly peace." It is there that our search for meaning and purpose comes to an end because it is there that we realize that Love has come down from Heaven – for us!


Today, Gaudete Sunday, we use the rose color candle and clergy wear rose vestments. The change in color provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation.
