

Listening to active members of the Church, as well as to persons who may feel excluded or estranged from the Church about their journey with Christ and with the Church.

Pope Francis wishes to enable people to communally or confidentially express, after prayer and reflection, how their parish and how the Church overall has enabled them to experience or not experience the love, compassion, mercy and consolation of God in their lives and the reality and support of a community of faith through the Catholic Church locally, nationally & globally.

After the first of the year, we will arrange for "listening sessions" and an online survey in which parishioners of all ages will be called to share from their own experiences the church's strengths and weaknesses, as well as the opportunities and challenges of our parish and the overall Church in fostering God's presence in their lives. We will then share our findings with Bishop Caggiano, who will in turn submit the feelings of our Diocese to Pope Francis.
