Resolutions

So here we are at that annual crossroads where we reflect on the year gone by and resolve to do something better, nicer, greater (you name it) in the year ahead. I've come to believe that the best way to formulate a list of new year's resolutions is to begin with prayer and dedicate the list-making – and even the year – to Mary, the Mother of God. Think about it, who better than Mary? She probably never made big plans, but she submitted completely to God's plan for her. She likely never created a list of things she would work on the following year, because she dedicated her life to obedience of the list of God's commandments in Torah. She may never have looked back on the year gone by with an ounce of regret because she proclaimed "the Almighty has done great things for me!" And she was never at a loss for what to do in a day, a week, or a year because her life was spent in quiet resolution to give her Son to the world and remind us to "do whatever he tells" you."

Let's go ahead and make those resolutions, but include with them our spiritual resolutions for the year: Mass more regularly. Mass every day; a decade of the Rosary, the Rosary every day; a prayer of thanksgiving in the morning, a prayer of thanksgiving morning, noon, and night; fifteen minutes before the Blessed Sacrament, and hour of Eucharistic Adoration. Or maybe we should make a list of people for whom we need to pray more often, or a list of those we need to forgive. Perhaps we might pick a day each week where we make sacrifices (fasting, time before the Blessed Sacrament, giving from our treasure) for the intentions of our Pope, bishop, or friends. How about becoming part of one of our ministries, or getting involved in writing to our government leaders about life, health, and the dignity of the human person. (If you want to know your pastor's intention for the year it's that two hundred people return to weekly Mass attendance in our parish - and I'd so appreciate your prayer and action on this one!)

You get it. I'll be praying for you and you put together your resolutions, and watch for an amazing opportunity in our parish to take your prayer life to a new and exciting place. (Spoiler alert: it's the pilgrimage we will take right here at Saint Aloysius with the Center for Ignatian Spirituality of Fairfield University in February.) Other opportunities will arise also.

Finally, I'm grateful to God for the gift of each one of you. One year ago I was given the gift of being your pastor, and I am humbled by your faithfulness, love, and generosity. I Thank you for all of it, and I am looking forward – with the help of Mary, Our Mother and Saint Aloysius – to what God has in store for us in the years ahead!
