

Words from Father Rob Kinnally

Tending to Our Parish, Part 2

In last week's column, I outlined the plan for our new pastoral council: three or four meetings per year, prayer and reflection in the morning followed by Mass, lunch and a working session in the afternoon – all guided by the Holy Spirit.

This week I will focus on the selection process and how you might pray about offering to serve. First let me say that we have selected the dates of the first two meetings. Since attendance at all meetings is mandatory, this information could inform your decision to submit your name. The first meeting will be Saturday, October 14, 2017. The second meeting will take place on Saturday, January 6, 2018.

Serving as a member of the council requires a commitment to daily prayer for fellow council members and the parish. It also means frequent reflection on parish life framed by the two-part question "How is Saint Aloysius parish experiencing Christ and what could we be doing to draw us closer to God and one another?" The thoughtful and prayerful response to that question will inform our discussion as a council and bring us closer to where God wants us to be. Listening to other parishioners between council meetings is another key responsibility. Active listening and receiving observations, ideas, and questions with patience and openness will help to shape the work of the council.

If you believe that you can make that commitment of time, prayer, and listening; and if you are willing to forego any agenda but God's, then I encourage you to place your name in the basket that will be on the steps of the sanctuary beginning on the Feast of the Assumption (August 15).

Please don't place any other name than your own; the process is about your personal discernment regarding service on the council. Names can be placed in the basket until September 8 (the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary). On Sunday, September 10 I will draw twelve names from the basket and those parishioners will be the members of the Saint Aloysius Pastoral Council.

Please pray about serving our parish in this unique and important way. I'm happy to answer any questions you may have as you discern this possibility.

I'll be on vacation this week; please pray for me as I always pray for you.










Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Our Lady's second appearance at Fatima

About fifty people turned up at the Cova da Iria on June 13 as the three children assembled near the Holm oak tree where the Lady had appeared. The children then saw a flash of light followed immediately by the apparition of Mary as she spoke to Lucia: "I want you to come on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn to read. Later, I will tell you what I want." Lucia asked Mary to take them to heaven and was reassured in this way: "I will take Jacinta and Francisco shortly, but you will stay here for some time to come. Jesus wants to use you to make me known and loved. He wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart throughout the world. I promise salvation to whoever embraces it. These souls will be dear to God, like flowers put by me to adorn his throne."

Lucia was sad at this reply and asked: "Am I to stay here alone?" Mary replied: "No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."

One of the witnesses to this apparition, Maria Carreira, described how Lucia then cried out and pointed as Mary departed. She herself heard a noise like "a rocket a long way off," and looked to see a small cloud a few inches over the tree rise and move slowly towards the east until it disappeared. The crowd of pilgrims then returned to Fatima where they reported the amazing things they had seen, the town was filled with an exceptionally large crowd of people because they were celebrating the Feast of Saint Anthony thus ensuring that there would be between two and three thousand people present for the promised July 13th apparition.

Did you know? June 13th is the feast day of Saint Anthony, who was born in Portugal and is the patron saint of Lost Souls. He brought countless fallen away Catholics back to the Church as well as many converts who did not yet know Jesus. He had a tremendous devotion to Our Blessed Mother. Was it any coincidence then that her second appearance was on his feast day (in the land of his birth) and her message was made known to a larger than usual crowd because of the feast day?


