Words from Andre Escaleira

"Bring it to Jesus."

We hear the Lord in today's Gospel challenge all of us who may be weary from carrying the weight of suffering to come to him. He promises rest, comfort, and peace, saying "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Today, the Lord is inviting us to lay our struggles, hardships, and burdens down at the foot of the Cross. Jesus is inviting you and me to leave all of these things with Him, trusting in His love, mercy, and providence. The Lord is asking us to "set [our] minds on the things that are above," "where neither moth nor rust consumes and thieves do not break in and steal" (Col 3:2; Mt 6:20). Jesus is inviting us to keep our gaze fixed on Him, to take up His yoke.

This, of course, is easier said than done. It's hard to let go of the challenges, difficulties, and hardships. It's hard to stop worrying about what tomorrow may bring. It's hard to completely surrender, to take up the yoke of Jesus, and to let Him do the heavy lifting. We as human beings want to solve problems, to work things out, all of which is good. But today, the Lord is inviting you and me to trust in Him a little deeper and to give these challenges, struggles, and hardships to Him. For "no one who believes in Him will be put to shame" (Rom 10:11).

So while you're with us in worship this Sunday, and even if you're home or away for the weekend, take the Lord's invitation to lay those burdens down at the Cross. Invite the Lord into your challenges, hardships, and struggles. Let Him take them on and do the heavy lifting. Take up His yoke, for it is easy and His burden is light.



Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Many people know that on May 13, 1917 Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to 3 shepherd children, Lucia do Santos, age 10 and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 8 and 7. However, many are unaware of key events leading up to that first apparition of Mary.

In the spring of 1916, the children had their first supernatural encounter as a means of preparing them for their meetings with the Queen of Heaven. As they were looking after the sheep one day they saw a dazzlingly beautiful young man, seemingly made of light, who told them he was the Angel of Peace. He invited them to pray with Him. Later on in the summer, the Angel again appeared to the children and encouraged them to pray and make sacrifices as a way of drawing down peace on their country. In the autumn the children again saw the Angel as they were looking after the sheep. He appeared before them holding a chalice in His hands, above which was suspended a host from which drops of blood were falling into the chalice. The Angel left the chalice suspended in the air and prostrated Himself before it in prayer. He then gave the host to Lucia to eat and let Francisco and Jacinta drink from the chalice while saving "Take and drink the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. horribly outraged by ungrateful men. Repair their crimes and console your God." Then he prostrated Himself again in prayer before disappearing. The children did not tell anyone about these visits of the Angel feeling an interior necessity to keep quiet about these events.

Another key event was that of the Pope at the time. Pope Benedict XV began a Novena for Peace to Our Blessed Mother. Keep in mind, WW I was raging with horrors people had not witnessed before. He began the Novena on May 5 and concluded it on May 13.


