📝 Words from Father Rob Kinnally

ADVENT

Advent has always been underplayed and underestimated in my opinion. It's a brief season of the Church year, just four weeks. This year the fourth week of Advent is compressed into one day – December 24 – because Christmas falls on a Monday. No one knows all the Advent hymns except for O Come, O Come Emmanuel, and everybody's sights are set on Christmas anyway. Christmas decorations and other Christmas paraphernalia are displayed the day after Halloween, Advent calendars are scarce, and I don't know any famous vocal artist who cut a decent Advent album. I once wrote to CBS Television with my script for "A Charlie Brown Advent," but I didn't even get a decent rejection letter. You get the point.

In the Church, Advent is a beautiful time where sacred waiting is dramatized by the beautiful prophesy of Isaiah and others. In that prophesy, the anticipation of the Promised One reaches a frenzy that can only be calmed by Mary's fiat – her "yes" to the angel Gabriel. This season of preparation for Christmas, that day when the "word was made flesh," highlights our own waiting – for the celebration of Christmas but also for the second coming of Christ in glory.

As a parish family, we will have many opportunities this Advent to get ready. Join us on December 6 in the school gym for a meal and receive a recipe box for a prayerful and meaningful Advent. Saint Nicholas will be there! That same evening, we will offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) – the best way to prepare our heart and soul to welcome the newborn King. Join us for Evening Prayer on two occasions, and, of course, our annual Christmas concert. Try to come to daily Mass and hear the unfolding of the mystery of the Incarnation and the different annunciations that have taken place throughout the history of salvation. Pray your way through Advent with one of the prayer resources we will provide, and keep the running around (shopping, etc.) to a minimum, and I promise you will have the best Advent and Christmas ever!


