Walking with the Saints in Advent

We are reminded on this First Sunday of Advent that this grace-filled season is a time of preparation for Christmas and for Christ's return on the Last Day. This year I would like to suggest some Saints that can walk with us in Advent. Their lives can inspire us to get ready for welcoming Christ on Christmas and assist us as we live out our discipleship every day. Each week I'll feature a different Saint; some have feast days in December, and that provides an opportunity to enter into prayer with them in a special way.

To get things started, I will invite you to embrace Mary, the Mother of God, this Advent. She stands as a shining example of obedience to God's will, something for which all Christians strive. As we celebrate her Immaculate Conception on December 8, we are reminded of her sinless nature, and how – in our sinfulness – we can ask her to intercede for us. When we hear the story of the Annunciation, perhaps we will be inspired by Mary's humble "yes" doing something extraordinary for God and pray that we may say "yes" when God asks us to do small things with great love.

Maybe our imagination can take us to that moment when, for the first time, Mary held in her arms the Savior of the World. What will it be like when Jesus holds us in His arms? Do we sense God holding us now? Advent might prompt us to ask who in our lives needs to be embraced. Is it someone who is lonely, poor, forgotten, or in need of our forgiveness? Is it someone who has been away from church and the Sacraments to whom we can extend a personal invitation to feel the embrace of Christ in our parish family?

Mary's powerful intercession brings us closer to her Son. As we begin our Advent journey, may we invite her along to learn how to open our hearts to the overwhelming love of God-with-us: Emmanuel!





Rosary beads and instructions on how to say the Rosary accompany the statue. Please take the opportunity to introduce this beautiful devotion to your family. If you have any questions about the




The New Canaan Christmas Giving Box

My Dear Friends in Christ:

I am writing to share important information about a new initiative regarding financial reporting at the parish, school and diocesan levels.

According to the diocesan Parish Finance Manual that was issued last year, every parish and diocesan school is required to report annually the results of their financial activities for the fiscal year ending June 30. In order for uniformity and consistency in reporting, the diocesan Finance Office has now created a standardized template that will be used going forward by all parishes and diocesan schools throughout the Diocese of Bridgeport. The Diocese and its related entities will also use the same template to issue their annual financial reports on the same day that the parishes and schools make their reports.

I have determined that the first Sunday of December every year will be known as "Accountability Sunday." On that day, this reporting will occur, and every parish and school, as well as the Diocese and its related entities will publish their annual financial reports simultaneously. This year, "Accountability Sunday" will fall on Sunday, December 5, 2021.

In short, the purpose of "Accountability Sunday" is to ensure financial transparency, to communicate to all parishioners and donors that good stewardship is being practiced and to provide a standard report that is consistent and straightforward. Individual reports will be made accessible via either parish bulletin or parish websites, school websites and the diocesan website. This new method of reporting comes after many months of preparation and is intended to ensure that the financial transparency already in place will be manifest in a new and more uniform presentation.

As we take this historic step, I wish to thank you for your continued support and generosity. Please be assured of my prayers for you and your families, especially as we begin this holy season of Advent.


