Humility: Bad for the Ego, Good for the Soul

While serving as a dean at Stanford University, I concluded a lengthy presentation to the university board of trustees with one final, compelling anecdote to drive home my point. Feeling confident that I had won over the esteemed gathering of university stewards, my self-imposed moment in the sun was interrupted by Dr. Condoleezza Rice, the provost. In a nutshell, these were her words: "Dean Kinnally, fine presentation but your last point is incorrect; the correct information is as follows..." In the small space that I have for this weekly column, I cannot adequately describe the feeling I had at that moment, but it was something like overwhelming terror combined with fear of the future and the end of an enjoyable career peppered with a persistent nausea.

After a productive conversation with my fact-checker, I took full responsibility for the bad info and we all moved on. I was never the same and that was just what I needed. We all pray for humility, but I'm convinced that until we suffer a bit of humiliation, we can't shed enough ego to experience the exaltation that God offers us if we become servants to God and one another. This is the Gospel truth for this week. In short, if we embody the qualities of the lowly, we are more attentive to God – who is the greatest – and to others who become our greatest concern.

I've always found these lines from the Church's Litany of Humility tremendously helpful on this point:

That others may be loved more than I, O Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.

That others may be esteemed more than I, That, in the opinion of the world, others may, increase and I may decrease, That others may be chosen and I set aside, That others may be praised and I unnoticed, That others may be preferred to me in everything, That others may become holier than I, provided that I may become as

holy as I should, O Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.
