Words from Father Rob Kinnally

You Can't Have It Both Ways

More than 50 years ago, Pope St. Paul VI wrote an encyclical entitled Populorum Progressio (On the Progress of Peoples). The work speaks to the essential problem of this Sunday's Gospel: you can't have it both ways. The rich young man asks Jesus how he can inherit eternal life, but he soon finds out that he would have to give up his wealth; and seemingly unable to do so, the young man walks away sad. Populorum Progressio warns people and the countries of the world about a selfserving accumulation of wealth: "Neither individuals nor nations should regard the possession of more and more goods as the ultimate objective. Every kind of progress is a two-edged sword. It is necessary if man is to grow as a human being; yet it can also enslave him, if he comes to regard it as the supreme good and cannot look beyond it. When this happens, men harden their hearts, shut out others from their minds and gather together solely for reasons of self-interest rather than out of friendship; dissension and disunity follow soon after. Thus the exclusive pursuit of material possessions prevents man's growth as a human being and stands in opposition to his true grandeur. Avarice, in individuals and in nations, is the most obvious form of stultified moral development." (Populorum Progressio, 19)

The spiritual lesson here is clear: be careful about accumulating anything that gets in the way of a rich life with God and a relationship with the poor. Put simply, you can't have it both ways because (as a famous play says) "you can't take it with you." There's nothing wrong or sinful about being wealthy, we simply need to use our treasure for the greater glory of God.






