Words from Father Rob Kinnally

Best Seat in the House

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him,

"Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?" They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?"

What's up with James and John in this passage? Did they really just ask Jesus to do "whatever we ask of you?" And did they really take the demand even further by asking to sit at the right and left of Jesus when the Lord comes into His glory? Pretty bold and brazen if you ask me.

However, if you think about it, sitting at the right and left hand of Jesus in the Kingdom seems like a splendid reward for staying close to Him as he walked the earth. While skeptics and critics walked away because they found Jesus' words too far outside their safe zone, James and John (and most of the "twelve") stuck by Jesus through all the radical teaching and breaking with pharisaic tradition. But Jesus makes it clear that true followers of Jesus have to "drink the cup that I drink." Staying close to Jesus in this life and in the next involves some sacrifice and suffering. We can't bypass the struggle and go directly to glory.

As Jesus slowly makes his way to Calvary in these ensuing chapters of Mark's Gospel, he teaches his followers what it means to be a real disciple. Becoming a true disciple means giving up old ways of understanding greatness, embracing service in the name of Jesus, and taking up a cross or two. Jesus says it plainly:

Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

In other words, where we are going to sit in the future has everything to do with where we stand now with Jesus and our sisters and brothers. May we start serving early so we can get a good seat!


