Words from Father Rob Kinnally

Two Opportunities

In these unique times, we have before us some wonderful opportunities in our local Church and the Church Universal. As we emerge from unprecedented moments of challenge, I believe we have a future that is filled with hope because it is rooted in Christ who is the same - yesterday, today, and forever.

The Holy Father has called the Universal Church to synod – a process of prayerful reflection, addressing essential questions, and moving forward to stay true to our mission work of spreading the Gospel and living the truth of the Gospel every day of our lives. Commencing in Rome on the 9th of October, the Synod opened in dioceses throughout the world last Sunday, October 17. The Synod document states clearly what is to happen: "By journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our 'journeying together' is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God."

The goal is to listen to as many voices as possible so that there is a clear understanding of where we are as a Church and present all the prayerful and thoughtful reflections to the Synod of Bishops that will take place in 2023. Each pastor in our diocese was asked to appoint four parishioners to serve as delegates to the synod journey. I am grateful to the Saint Aloysius delegates for saying "yes" to helping me shepherd this important process. Our delegates are Nicole Perone Grosso. Buddy Kretzman, Jose Morales, and Christine Otis. You will be hearing from this team in the weeks and months ahead as we invite you into dialogue. The Vatican document on the Synod can be found at: https://www.synod.va/en.html .

The other opportunity is the Ambassador program initiated by Bishop Caggiano. Called to accompany those who may have walked away from Church for many reasons, these missionaries will receive theological training and spend time in prayer as they invite back our sisters and brothers to our family of faith. I have asked some to help me with the leadership of this important ministry, but I invite those of you who feel like God may be nudging you to learn more about this to contact me directly: frrob@starcc.com. Please pray for the fruitful outcome of these opportunities in the life of our wonderful Catholic Church. The Lord has a loving plan for us as we embark; may He bless us on our way!






