

Won't You Be My Neighbor?

Some of you will remember "Mister Roger's Neighborhood," the Channel 13/PBS program featuring Fred Rogers. The theme song of the show was "Won't You Be My Neighbor?" Every day on the show was "a beautiful day in the neighborhood" because the cast of characters – both human and puppet – experienced just a small dose of challenge that was wonderfully resolved by the end of the 25-minute episode. Fred Rogers was an ordained minister and his ministry was the show. The subtle message of the "neighbor" song spoke to Jesus' desire to have us extend our own understanding of "neighbor" far beyond our own back yards. Mister Rogers' creation of the make-believe land outside his own comfort zone represents a desire to have children think beyond the familiar and venture into uncharted

For those of us who are grown-ups, God speaks to us in Scripture plainly about "neighbor." In today's first reading from the Book of Exodus, God warns us to be attentive to the alien, widows, orphans, and those from whom we borrow. In fact, the Lord cautions that if those in need cry out to God because we are not caring for them, there are consequences. Today we hear the cries of those who are both in our back yard and in faraway places like the Middle East and Puerto Rico. There are also those without a voice who plead for help: the victims of oppression, those struggling with addiction, the lonely, those without gainful employment, the mentally ill, immigrants who live in fear of deportation, and more. All are neighbors because they are named by God as His children and destined for our care through prayer and action.

The holiday season will soon be upon us. It's a great time to give thanks to God for blessings, and to give thanks to God for the opportunity to identify who needs our love, care, time, and treasure. It's the perfect time to stand before the ones who are alone in their struggle and say, "please, won't you be my neighbor."


Sacred Heart in Greenwich will host an Open House for students interested in Kindergarten – Grade 12 on
