Words from Father Rob Kinnally

Made in God's Image Forever: But What If ...?

The creation passages in the Book of Genesis tell us that humanity is made in the "image of God." This is why we can dare to say that we are holy and can *grow* in holiness. This is why we can speak of the uncompromised beauty of all God's "creatures great and small." And this is why "a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife and the two shall become one flesh." As God desires to be in relationship with all of us, so too are we given the gift of being drawn to one another and why so many live that out in married life.

So why the emphasis on divorce in today's readings? Because God desires marriage itself to be sacred and lasting. The "for the rest of your lives" part of marriage flows from God's everlasting covenant with humanity. Like all Sacraments, marriage is instituted by Christ and imparts grace to all who receive the Sacrament. Christ, who lives forever, gives that gift of sacramental grace forever. Nonetheless, sometimes marriage is not meant to be forever because something has gone awry. When that occurs, the Church offers counsel, care, and a process that considers the covenant between husband and wife. Seeking a declaration of nullity (an annulment) in the Church is meant to provide a pastoral experience of hope and help. I will admit that sometimes that is true and sometimes that is not the experience of individuals who have gone through that process. In the past several years, I have seen many improvements in the annulment process that have made it a more pastoral experience. It begins with the desire to preserve the covenant and heal the relationship.

As a community of faith, we must all work together to encourage marriage, pray for those who desire to be married, and pray for married couples through the intercession of Mary and Joseph and Saints Louis and Zelie Martin (the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux). Our parish's newly formed marriage preparation ministry provides mentors for couples preparing for marriage along with an opportunity to walk with these mentors in the early years of marriage. Our patron saints are Louis and Zelie, and amazing things are already happening!

We must also pray and support those who are having difficulty in their marriage. I encourage any of you who are struggling to reach out to me or any of our clergy. We are here to pray with you, help you to heal, discern what God desires for your marriage, and walk you through next steps.

In 1 John 4:12 we read: "If we love one another, God remains in us and his love is brought to perfection in us." Made in God's image, we go forth with Christ to live in love. May God grant us life-giving and holy relationships!






