#### Forgiveness 101

The gracious king in this Sunday's Gospel forgives readily. God forgives readily. We don't. Instead, we hold grudges, avoid the person, reel with resentment, and crucify the one who "did me wrong" on the cross of gossip. God's ability to forgive so freely is part of God's being. In fact, God *expects* that forgiveness is a part of our being. Consider a phrase of the Lord's Prayer where forgiveness on our part is *assumed*: "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

So how do we learn to forgive with the same kind of abandon that God forgives? One way is to watch what God does in the lives of those who forgive. Do you remember that moment when Pope Saint John Paul went to a Roman prison and forgave the man who tried to kill him?

The recent hurricanes gave many of us a renewed sense of perspective and what is important. That sense of perspective and priorities was demonstrated by the gratitude of survivors who experienced material loss: "We have lost everything including our home, but we are thankful to be standing here talking to you. We will rebuild when we can."

That gift of perspective should therefore move us to say, "I suffered because of a wrong done to me, but I forgive because I need to be free of the burden of holding a grudge so that I can do what God wants me to do next. And I need to free the other person from the prison of resentment into which I have placed him."

In sum, here's how to forgive:

Name the person you need to forgive. Ask God to bless that person. Forgive him or her. Enjoy the freedom you feel. Repeat as necessary – at least seventy-seven times.

I'm praying for you.

#### **Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**



The 6th and final apparition of our Blessed Mother occurred on October 13, 1917.

As she had promised, God performed a miracle through Our Blessed Mother. It had been raining for two days but that did not stop both the faithful and the doubters to come to the Cova to witness the promised miracle.

Our Blessed Mother appeared to the children and instructed them to encourage people to pray and repent. She revealed herself under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary.

As our Lady rose toward the east she turned the palms of her hands toward the dark sky. While the rain had stopped, dark clouds continued to obscure the sun, which suddenly burst through them and was seen to be a soft spinning disk of silver. The sun then began to "dance" and spin while illuminating multiple colors. To some it appeared to be hurling towards earth!

As this was happening, Lucia had a vision of the mysteries of the Rosary. At the conclusion of what came to be known as "The Miracle of the Sun" the 70,000 people discovered that the muddy and rain soaked ground was dry, as was their wet clothing.
