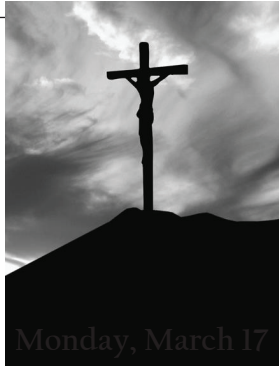


LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age to 59 years of age. Those who are bound by this regulation may take only one full meal a day but are not prohibited from taking other food, keeping in mind the reason for fasting and penance.

The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on **almsgiving**, which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is a witness to fraternal charity and a work of justice pleasing to God.

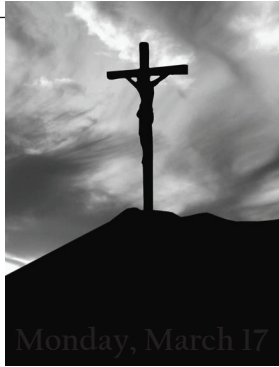
