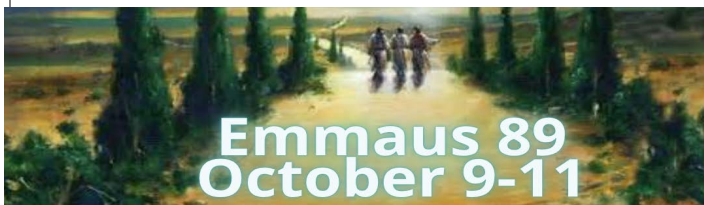

Music Notes for 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time **Dr. John Michniewicz**

Sunday's readings highlight the same truth: God's generosity is not measured by human expectations. In the First Reading, Isaiah 55:6-9, the people are called to seek God who promises mercy, since God's ways are far above human ways. In the Responsorial Psalm that follows, Psalm 145, the Psalmist praises God as gracious, merciful, and near to all who call on God.

In the Second Reading, Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a, Paul writes from prison that he is at peace, since "life is Christ, and death is gain." In the Gospel, Matthew 20:1-16a, Jesus tells the parable of a landowner who pays every vineyard worker the same wage regardless of when hired, answering the complaint of unfairness by asking, "are you envious because I am generous?"

The Entrance hymn, *God, Whose Giving Knows No Ending*, was written by Robert Edwards in 1961 for a Hymn Society stewardship competition. The text gives thanks for God's giving, without limit, echoing the Gospel's theme of unearned generosity.

The Presentation hymn, *Called to Labor in God's Vineyard*, was written in 2011 by Fr. James Chepponis, a priest and composer in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. The hymn reflects God's generosity towards all the workers in the vineyard and is a call towards a thankful and faithful response.

At the 11:30 Mass, the choir sings Martin Shaw's 1923 anthem *With a Voice of Singing*, its text adapted from Isaiah 48:20, declaring God's grace that extends to the ends of the earth.

For the Communion Meditation, *10,000 Reasons* (Bless the Lord), written by Matt Redman and Jonas Myrin in 2011 and drawn from Psalm 103, is sung; at the 11:30 Mass the choir sings *Fauré's Ecce Fidelis Servus*, on a text from Luke 12:42 about the faithful servant.

The Final Hymn, *Now Thank We All Our God*, was written by Martin Rinkart during a plague in the Thirty Years' War. Its closing line declares that God's goodness "was, is now, and shall be evermore."
