Words from Father Rob Kinnally

Supporting and Welcoming the Kosenko Family from Ukraine: WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Since the beginning of the war in Ukraine in March, more than 3 million people have fled that country. Many have found a safe haven in neighboring countries like Poland. As you may have heard, the U.S. has agreed to welcome 100,000 refugees who are sponsored. Under the leadership of parishioner Paul Knag and his law firm Murtha Cullina, our parish has located a Ukrainian family to sponsor and support. Therefore, I am pleased to inform you that Saint Aloysius will support **Andrii and Mariia Kosenko and their two daughters** (age 8 and 9), providing a safe place and fresh start right here in New Canaan.

We are hopeful that the Kosenko Family can travel to New Canaan sometime in July after all of the necessary paperwork is completed. But when they arrive, they will literally need *everything* until they can get settled and find employment. Paul and the hard-working, energetic committee of parishioners have been collecting furniture and other essentials, investigating job training and employment options, coordinating English lessons for the entire family, trying to locate a car for the family's use, and more. I am so inspired by this committee's dedication!

I had the privilege of meeting Mariia, Andrii and their girls when the committee had a Zoom call with them on Tuesday. We laughed and cried together as we told them about our desire to help them. I assured them that we are already praying for them and for the people of Ukraine. They sent us some great family photos; you can see them below.

One of the greatest and most pressing needs is housing in New Canaan. The rental market is nearly depleted, and rents are high, so we are hopeful that there is an in-law apartment, barn apartment, or carriage house available in town for low rent or no rent. Maybe there is space in your home for this wonderful family of four for a few months. Please join me in praying for some breakthrough moments to find a home for Andrii, Mariia, and their daughters.

To aid with some of the general expenses -- including traveling to the U.S. and getting started with life in a new country -- we will have a **special collection on the weekend of June 11 and 12**. Please be as generous as you can. We think that with \$50,000 or more, we can get the Kosenko's off to a good start. Every gift will help. Thank you in advance for your generosity, and please pray for Ukraine and the safe journey of the Kosenko Family.

Religious Education Grades K - 8

REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN!

Registration for Religious Education Grades K-8 2022-2023 academic year is now open. ***This year we will be offering Kindergarten Classes***, increasing our Religious Education program offering from Kindergarten through 8th Grade. Due to construction of our new Faith Formation Center building, **all K-6 classes will be held at South School on Sundays** (with exception of our new "Choir and Religious Education" program). Eighth grade students in Confirmation prep classes previously held on the St. Aloysius campus will be notified with your new location.

South School Class Time Options

Early Morning Session from 8:45 a.m. - 9:45 a.m.

Late Morning Session 11:15 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.

Afternoon Session 3:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Class times were purposely configured around our Church schedule, allowing students to attend Mass. Families continue to have the option to choose a homeschool track where we will provide you the materials you need to teach your children at home. Please note 1st and 2nd graders must attend class in person as this is a sacramental preparation year and we do not allow homeschooling.

NEW - Choir and Religious Education

Religious Education has partnered with the St. Aloysius Music Ministry for an exciting alternative to traditional CCD Class! Starting this fall, your child/children will have the option to participate in the St. Aloysius Youth Choir as their Religious Education fulfillment. Both CCD material and Youth Choir material will be covered during each session. This class will be limited to 50 students in Grades 3-6. Details are as follows:

- CCD/Choir Rehearsal Sunday morning from 8:30-9:45 a.m. in Stapleton Hall (required)
- Youth Choir will sing at one scheduled 10am Mass per month. Dates TBD (required)
- Youth Choir will sing at special Christmas and Easter Concerts/Masses (required, *exceptions permitted on a case-by-case basis)

Students who register for this class will be required to attend a scheduled "Meet & Greet Audition" prior to the start of classes to ensure this class is the right fit! This Religious Education alternative is perfect for children who are interested in music or have already participated in musical activities in some capacity. However, all levels are welcome! Registration is open for all classes and will close on July 29th, 2022.

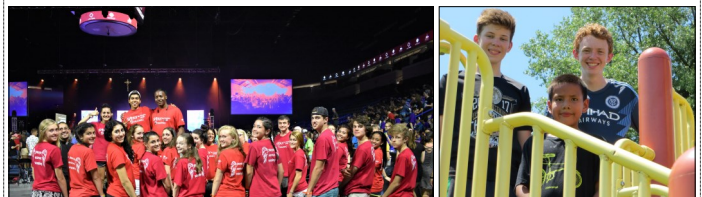

A Message from Fr. Rob

Today, Bishop Frank Caggiano announced that I will become Vicar General of the Diocese of Bridgeport, effective June 21, 2022. Though I will relinquish my job as Diocesan Chancellor, I am delighted to share that I will remain pastor of Saint Aloysius. Deacon Patrick Toole will assume the role of Chancellor and maintain his responsibility as Episcopal Delegate for Administration.

I am also excited to share with you that our own Deacon Bill Santulli will become Vice Chancellor of the Diocese and will also continue to minister at Saint Aloysius.

For those of you who don't know, the Vicar General assists the bishop in the running of the diocese and acts, along with other members of the diocesan curia, as an advisor to the bishop. The Vice Chancellor assists the Chancellor, particularly in matters related to the verification of ecclesiastical documents in the case of impending marriages and declarations of nullity.

Two other pastors of Saint Aloysius have held the office of Vicar General. Monsignors Peter Cullen and William Scheyd served in that capacity.

I am very much looking forward to continuing my ministry as your pastor, and I am grateful to Bishop Caggiano for understanding the importance of being present to the parish while assisting him in his ministry as bishop. Please pray for me and for Deacon Bill as we begin these important responsibilities!
