Attorney Paul Knag of our parish has been assisting families from Ukraine who have been evacuated to Mexico and are awaiting the help they need to move forward and make a temporary home in the United States. This is an urgent need and would involve a parish-wide effort to provide or facilitate housing, education, and other resources. I would ask that you pray about how God might be calling you or your family to participate.

We would like to form a small committee of interested parishioners who would be willing to bring their prayers, ideas, and maybe some expertise so that we can create a structure and process to help immediately. This week, the United States Senate will vote on the "Women's Health Protection Act," deceptively named legislation that would cancel state pro-life laws and codify Roe v. Wade as the law of the land. Further, the bill would not provide meaningful religious exemptions, thus forcing Catholic medical professionals and hospitals to perform, or participate in, abortions.

Not only is this legislation bad public policy, but its provisions are also deeply unpopular with the American people. A 2022 Knights of Columbus/Marist Poll found that more than 70% of Americans would limit abortion to, at most, the first three months of pregnancy. Additionally, almost two-thirds of Americans believe that abortion should either be illegal or determined at the state level. Finally, 75% believe that doctors and nurses should be able to follow their consciences and not be forced to perform abortions.

Our bishops have asked everyone to contact both of their U.S. Senators to speak out against this bill. Visit the <u>US Conference</u> of <u>Catholic Bishops' action center</u> today and register your opposition to this bill which would make abortion-on-demand the law of the land.


