Gratitude to God and You at Christmas

The patron Saint of the Diocese of Bridgeport, Saint Augustine, said of the Incarnation: "Nothing was so necessary for raising our hope as to show us how deeply God loved us. And what could afford us a stronger proof of this than that the Son of God should become a partner with us of human nature?"

As we navigate a world that often challenges our sensibilities, our longing for a peaceful world -- and even the truth, Christ comes at Christmas to bring light to our darkness, and hope born of love from God. That the Savior comes to us as one like us (in all things but sin), truly speaks to God's enduring love for us. How life-giving it is to know that Christ accompanies us as God-made-Man through all the joys and sorrows of life.
