Do I Know a Lazarus?


In an address to the United Nations on September 25, 2020, Pope Francis offered world leaders a challenge:

We are faced, then, with a choice between two possible paths. One path leads to the consolidation of multilateralism as the expression of a renewed sense of global co-responsibility, a solidarity grounded in justice and the attainment of peace and unity within the human family, which is God's plan for our world. The other path emphasizes self-sufficiency, nationalism, protectionism, individualism and isolation; it excludes the poor, the vulnerable and those dwelling on the peripheries of life. That path would certainly be detrimental to the whole community, causing self-inflicted wounds on everyone. It must not prevail.

In this Sunday's Gospel from Luke, the rich man had the opportunity to be in relationship with Lazarus but chose not to share his time or treasure with Lazarus. Once again Jesus takes the wealthy to task, not just because they are wealthy, but because they do not share their excess of resources with those in need. Every day we have the opportunity to grow in relationship with those who are hurting, lonely, sick, and hungry. How do we choose to respond?

Praying that we never miss an opportunity to know, love, and help a Lazarus,

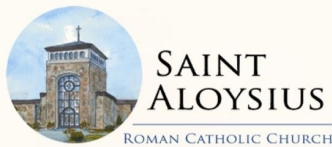

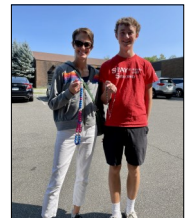

Volunteering at the Parish?

If you are a parish volunteer of any kind, the diocese requires that you are compliant with the requirements of safe environments (VIRTUS). This involves taking the initial "Protecting God's Children" class and executing a background check. If it has been more than 5 years since your initial training, you need to take a short refresher course online and execute a new background check. The refresher will be indicated in your online VIRTUS account.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, RCIA, is an awakening to Christ and seeking out the Catholic Church that comes about in a variety of ways. The first step for some is a sense that “something is missing”, that there is more to life than what they now have. For many others, the journey begins because of a relationship with a Catholic – a close friend or spouse. Some were baptized Catholic but did not receive any other sacraments. Still others are drawn by seeing the example of a Catholic life well lived.

The process is a series of carefully planned stages, marked by liturgical rites, in which those who are interested in becoming full Catholics join us in a continuing and deepening conversion into faith and discipleship. RCIA takes the spiritual needs of each person into account. At the Easter Vigil Mass candidates will receive those sacraments of initiation that they need – Baptism, the Eucharist, and Confirmation.

In mid-September our parish will begin weekly RCIA sessions in an open and welcoming environment. These gatherings are open to people who are unbaptized as well as those who are baptized Christians from Protestant or Evangelical backgrounds.

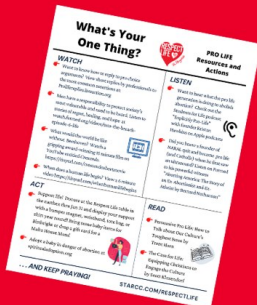
