Words from Monsignor Rob Kinnally

Recognizing Jesus

In the story of the road to Emmaus, it was not until Jesus blessed, broke, and shared bread that the two recognized their traveling companion. Although they had walked with Him and listened to Him connect the prophecy of Scripture to His own life and ministry, they didn't really know it was Jesus. Many of the post-Resurrection stories are filled with moments of people not recognizing the Risen Lord right away. It often takes a word or an action from Jesus Himself for people who know it's really Jesus. So it goes for us sometimes. We may miss an experience of Jesus in our midst if we make assumptions about where we will find Him and what He will say and do.

As we go about life we can't allow doubt, fear, or disappointment cloud our experience of the Risen Jesus who is right before our eyes, dwelling in our hearts, or fully alive in the ones who love us. In my worst moments, I always hear Jesus saying: "Peace. Do not be afraid. I am with you always." When I am tired and frustrated, I hear Jesus saying: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Put simply, if we know the Jesus of the Gospels and all that He said and did, our anxiety can be transformed into a new awakening about His abiding presence and His desire to walk with us through it all.

Finally, how often are we surprised by Jesus who appears in that person who has come to our rescue? Whether it was a kind word, a thoughtful gesture, or something heroic, we are graced by many who represent Christ blessing us.

The Risen Lord is in our midst and knows what we need. If we accept that truth, we will always know Him *and* recognize Him.

Alleluia! He is Risen!

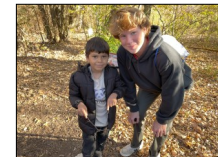

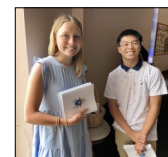
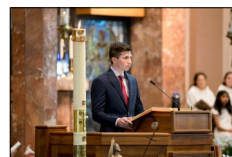

WILL YOU LAY DOWN YOUR LIFE?

CLARITY AFTER TRAGEDY LEADS TO PRIESTHOOD

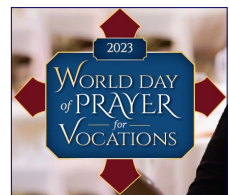
Thirteen years ago, Catholic school teacher David Roman was huddled together with students in Danbury, Connecticut. Just a few miles away, at Sandy Hook Elementary, there was an active shooter and all area schools were on lockdown. In those tragic hours, all he knew to do was pray the rosary.

"I asked the kids to pray for people who were hurting, and for people who hurt others," Fr. Roman recalled. "Later, I was reflecting on all of it and I realized how much I loved those kids. I realized that I would die for them."

As he re-lived that awful day in prayer, David felt the Lord asking, "You would die for those children. What will you do for the rest of my people?"

The truth was, he had spent a lot of time telling his students about the priesthood, but he'd never thought about it for himself. Thus began a long journey of discernment, and eventually seminary. He was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Bridgeport in 2019.

Fr. Roman has since learned that the priesthood really is about sacrificing everything. Like Jesus, priests are called to lay down their lives to be present to people, certainly through the sacraments, but also in the most painful moments of life.

Demolition and Construction Update
On April 17, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted unanimously to approve our demolition and rebuilding! They complimented us on the beauty of our planned buildings and green space and how much our project will add to the social and cultural community of New Canaan. Once we have successfully disconnected water and power from the school building and 30 Maple Street, and have the green light from the town, we will begin taking down those buildings. I'm happy that we will be salvaging part of the 30 Maple building. Demolition should commence on May 1. Construction will begin once we receive the appropriate permits; we estimate this to happen in early summer. If you haven't seen them yet, the updated drawings for the project are posted in the narthex and on the website.

As a parish, we are planning to launch a Pre-K program in our new building to be completed in approximately two years. We are forming committees to start planning for these programs. Along with nearly 1,000 religious education students, the Pre-K children will have beautiful new learning space, and we will have the meeting rooms to accommodate our more than 40 active parish ministries.

To finalize our plans, we must have clarity on meeting our \$26 million target. We are in the middle of our April 16-23 "From the Ground Up: A Week of Giving to Our Building Campaign" to focus and encourage everyone to make a campaign pledge. There will be information opportunities after each of the weekend Masses in the narthex of the church. We hope that you will stop by the tables to review the drawings and ask any questions. We can also set up individual meetings if you would prefer. Currently 375 families have made a commitment to the project. That number represents 31% of active parishioners. **We need everyone to make this a reality. Thank you for prayerfully considering a pledge, and remember that pledges can be spread out over 5 years.**

I hope to see you along with some of our campaign committee members this weekend to get all of your questions answered, and we need you too! Together we can make this a reality.


