Words from Monsignor Rob Kinnally

### Resurrection and Hope

As I write this message on Palm Sunday, war is raging in the Middle East and the processions with palms that would normally take place near the Church of the Holy Sepulcher were not held out of precaution. In other parts of the world, places of worship are targets of attackers, and anxiety grows as the effects of world conflict spread beyond the battle fronts. Amid the unrest, Holy Week happens and the paschal mystery unfolds before us: the suffering, dying, and rising of Jesus. Scourging moves to crucifixion and death, but God's power over death breaks through all darkness and floods our hearts with the light of hope on Easter morning.

I worry about the world, but I take comfort in what the Resurrection teaches us about rising from everything including fear, despair, anger, and uncertainty. Good Friday ends, and after a Holy Saturday of entombment, we are propelled into the glory of Easter morning. The tomb is empty and Jesus is alive, and He is still alive, and he loves us and wants us to live forever. With that knowledge we navigate a complicated world confident that we will be given all that we need to bring our Easter hope and joy to all who are wounded and wondering.

I've always loved what the beginning of the First Letter of Peter says to us about the hope that Resurrection brings to our moments of trial and tribulation. I'm happy to share what Peter says:

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you who by the power of God are safeguarded through faith, to a salvation that is ready to be revealed in the final time.

In this you rejoice, although now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

Although you have not seen him you love him; even though you do not see him now yet believe in him, you rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, as you attain the goal of [your] faith, the salvation of your souls." (1 Peter 1:3-9)

I will remember you and your intentions at my Easter Masses, and I pray that you will revel in the truth that Jesus is truly risen. Alleluia!

## ~ Faith Formation ~

### Music Notes for Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord Dr. John Michniewicz

The focus for April 5, 2026, is on the foundation of the Christian faith, Jesus' Resurrection. The first reading recounts Peter's proclamation of Christ's resurrection (Acts 10:34a, 37-43), the Gospel reading recounts the eyewitness account of Mary Magdalene and the disciples finding the empty tomb.

Easter is one of the few Sunday during the year that features a "Sequence Hymn." The Sequence Hymn prescribed for Easter Day, Victimae Paschali Laudes, functions as a dramatic dialogue, explicitly inviting Mary Magdalene to testify to "The empty tomb of my living Lord". The setting by James Biery uses the ancient chant melody, but uses the first line as a repeated refrain to invite congregational participation.

The classic Easter entrance hymn, Jesus Christ Is Risen Today, was written by the great English hymn writer Charles Wesley in 1739. The hymn features repeated melismatic "Alleluias." A melisma features many notes to one syllable, and this recalls and connects the hymn to ancient Easter Alleluia Gregorian chant settings.

Marty Haugen's setting of the Responsorial Psalm 118, Let Us Rejoice, musically celebrates the passage about "the stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone," serving as a metaphor for Christ's exaltation after his Passion.

The choir will feature anthems by contemporary liturgical composer K. Lee Scott for choir, percussion, brass and organ: This Is The Day and The Glory of Christ, as well as an anthem from the majestic English Romantic tradition by Charles Villiers Stanford: Ye Choirs of New Jerusalem. Sunday's final hymn, Jesus Is Risen, Let Us Sing, is set to the famous 17th-century German tune LASST UNS ERFREUEN with its exuberant and repeated Alleluias, fitting for an Easter celebration.


