A Lot Going On – Thanks be to God!

Feast of Saint Aloysius

The Feast of Saint Aloysius is June 21 on the Roman Church Calendar. This year, the 21st is the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, and therefore the saint's feast would normally be skipped in deference to the Sunday; however, as a parish family, we will celebrate our patron, Aloysius Gonzaga. We will welcome Bishop Caggiano on that day who will celebrate a special Mass at Noon followed by the blessing of our new Education and Faith Center. Aloysius was a friend and selfless servant to the sick during the time of a devastating plague. Foregoing a military career like that of his father, Aloysius joined the Society of Jesus where he was assigned to work with the sick. At age 23, our patron worked tirelessly to care for those who were suffering from the symptoms of the plague. He bathed them, carried them into bed, talked with them, prayed with them, and closed their eyes when they died. He eventually died from the plague, and his compassion was widely known. As we come to church next weekend, we might look up at our statue of Aloysius and say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask his intentions for healing and for the care and protection of our youth. Saint Aloysius, pray for us!

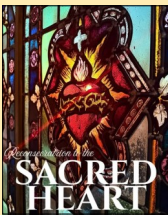
Blessed are We!

Music Notes for Dr. John Michniewicz



The Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time presents readings that, taken together, outline a single story: those whom God has chosen and loved, though they are imperfect, are sent out to continue Christ's mission in the world. Exodus 19 announces God's covenant; Psalm 100 responds in praise; Romans 5 shows God's covenant, bringing salvation through Christ's sacrifice; and Matthew 10 turns the covenant into commission as Jesus sends the Disciples out to serve.

The Entrance Hymn, Praise to the Lord, the Almighty (LOBE DEN HERREN), is a paraphrase of Psalms 103 and 150 by Joachim Neander (1650–1680), whose second verse, "shelters thee under his wings," connects directly to God's loving eagle-wings imagery found in Exodus 19.

The Presentation Hymn, All People That on Earth Do Dwell (OLD HUNDREDTH), is William Kethe's 1561 metrical paraphrase of the appointed Psalm 100, one of the oldest hymns still in continuous use; at the 11:30 Mass, the Choir sings Allen Pote's A Jubilant Song, echoing Psalm 100 and the desire to bring about God's Kingdom.

The Communion Hymn, Take, O Take Me As I Am by John Bell, mirrors the disciples' response to Christ's call in Matthew 10; at the 11:30 Mass, the Choir sings Godfrey Sampson's My Song Shall Be Aways of the Lovingkindness of the Lord, a setting of Psalm 89, showing the Hebrew concept of hesed, steadfast covenant love, that runs through all of Sunday's scripture texts.

The Final Hymn, Go to the World! (SINE NOMINE) by Sylvia Dunstan, is a direct setting of the Great Commission, whose missionary charge also drives Matthew 10; the tune by Ralph Vaughan Williams, originally paired with For All the Saints, transforms its memorial character into a hymn celebrating the Disciples' mission.

Convalidation

Catholics who were married outside the Catholic Church and wish to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony can do so through convalidation. The Church cares for her members as the Body of Christ.



For this reason, baptized Catholics are expected to marry in the Church and receive the grace that Christ freely offers in the Sacrament of Matrimony.

If you are a Catholic and are not in a sacramental marriage, it is very easy to enter into the Sacrament of Matrimony, provided you are free to marry in the Church. Some people refer to convalidation as the Church "blessing" a marriage. In fact, it is the actual exchange of vows, the actual sacrament that takes place. If either party was previously married, proof of an annulment must be provided.

There is no specific preparation time required for those already married.

The requirements are as follows:

- One of the parties requesting a wedding must be a baptized, practicing Catholic who is registered in the parish and is free to marry. This means that any previous marriages by either the Catholic or non-Catholic must already be annulled or the proper paperwork finalized.
- Catholics are required to submit a newly issued baptismal record, and non-Catholics are required to submit a photocopy of their original baptismal record.
- Meet with the priest once or twice in preparation for the sacrament.
- Go to sacramental confession.
- Exchange vows.


