Gratitude and Thoughts about Summer

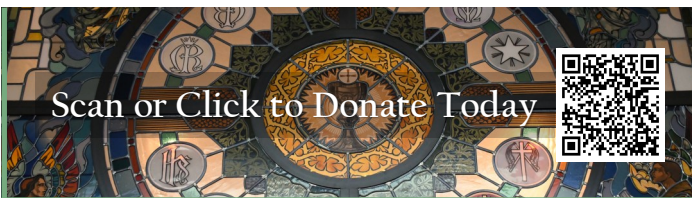

Music Notes for Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Dr. John Michniewicz

The readings for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time center on hospitality, discipleship, and the cost of following Christ, with the Shunammite woman of 2 Kings, the baptismal theology of Romans 6, and the radical call of Matthew 10 forming a unified scriptural thread.

The Entrance Hymn, *A Living Faith*, connects directly to the Gospel's call to take up the cross, rooted in the history of English Catholic martyrdom and expanded by Joseph R. Alfred's additional verses to include mothers, sisters, and brothers in the community of faithful witness.

The Preparation Hymn, *Jesus Promises Communion*, sets the contemporary hymn writer Adam Tice's thoughtful theological text to the familiar American folk tune NETTLETON, drawing together the themes of hospitality, unity, and the paschal mystery, echoing both the First Reading and the Gospel.

The Communion Hymn, *Here I Am Lord*, written quickly to fulfill a colleague's request by Daniel Schutte in 1979, has become one of the most well-known and loved contemporary hymns. It takes the form of a dialogue between God's call and the believer's questioning but willing response, capturing the human reality of discipleship at the heart of Matthew 10.

The Closing Hymn, *To Be Your Presence*, gives a direct charge to carry what has been received into the world, its text by Delores Dufner paired with Stanford's memorable hymn tune ENGELBERG, whose three-bar phrases and repeated alleluias give it both stateliness and forward momentum.

Convalidation

Catholics who were married outside the Catholic Church and wish to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony may do so through convalidation. As the Body of Christ, the Church desires to accompany and care for her



members, inviting baptized Catholics to enter into marriage within the Church and receive the grace Christ offers through this sacrament. If you are Catholic and not currently in a sacramental marriage, entering into the Sacrament of Matrimony is often a simple process, provided you are free to marry in the Church. Convalidation is sometimes described as having a marriage "blessed" by the Church, but it is actually the exchange of vows and the celebration of the sacrament itself.

If either spouse has been previously married, proof of an annulment (or completed marriage nullity process) must be provided before proceeding.

There is no set preparation period for couples who are already civilly married.

Requirements:

- At least one spouse must be a baptized, practicing Catholic, registered in the parish, and free to marry in the Church. Any previous marriages of either spouse (Catholic or non-Catholic) must be annulled or otherwise resolved through the proper Church process.
- Catholics must provide a newly issued baptismal certificate. Non-Catholics should provide a copy of their original baptismal record.
- Meet with the priest once or twice in preparation for the sacrament.
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).
- Exchange marriage vows in the Church.


