Words from Monsignor Rob Kinnally

Why is it so Difficult to Forgive?

Once again, the Sunday Scriptures speak of forgiveness. Many of us believe the act of forgiving someone is one of the toughest things we must do. If we have experienced mercy and forgiveness ourselves, why is it so difficult to extend mercy and forgiveness to others? If I entered the confessional a miserable sinner but left the same confessional forgiven and glowing in grace and reveling in Christ's mercy, why can't I let go of the anger and hurt and just forgive? Here's the answer: we don't know Jesus well enough. If we took the time to contemplate his unconditional love for the worst of sinners and his ardent desire to go after the one lost sheep, we would trust him to walk with us into that uncomfortable place of letting go of our pride and surrendering to his will. If we were to forfeit pride, ego, and misdirected righteousness and allow God to cool our fiery emotions, we will love like Jesus loves. And loving like Jesus means it will be easier to love the ones that are difficult to love and forgive the ones who have hurt us. This means sacrifice – dying to self and living for others.

From the crucified Jesus, we know mercy and love poured out for you and me. Our task of forgiving one another is nothing compared to that afternoon on Calvary. When we extend love to a sinner, that love is transforming and moves a hardened heart to gratitude. Maybe we need to be reminded of the gratitude we felt when we were forgiven. Maybe we need to be reminded of what Saint Paul says to us in the second reading: "we should not live for ourselves; we should imitate God." Maybe we should imagine God overwhelmed with joy at our gestures of mercy and tenderness toward those who are difficult to love. Thanks be to God for the gifts of forgiveness and mercy!

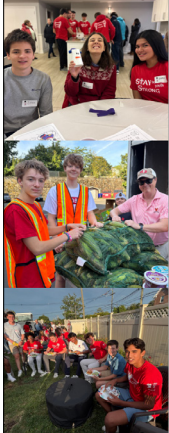

Music Notes for 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Dr. John Michniewicz

Sunday's readings for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time center on the idea that God's mercy is meant to extend beyond the person who receives it. In the First Reading, Sirach warns against nursing anger, Psalm 103 names God as "kind and merciful," Paul reminds believers in the Second Reading that they belong to the Lord, and the Gospel parable shows what happens when someone forgiven a great debt refuses to forgive a small one.

Sunday's Entrance hymn is *Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven*, written by Henry Francis Lyte and published in 1834, a paraphrase of Psalm 103 whose opening verse reflects Sunday's theme: "ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven."

Sunday's Presentation hymn, *As We Gather at Your Table*, features a text by Carl P. Daw Jr., commissioned in 1989 by Eastern Shore Chapel Episcopal Church for its tricentennial. Verse 2 asks directly for "your great compassion to forgive as you forgive."

At the 11:30 Mass, the Presentation anthem sung by the Choir is *My Song Shall Be Always of the Loving-Kindness of the Lord*. This anthem, by English composer Godfrey Sampson, sets Psalm 89's language of God's steadfast loving-kindness, and reflects Psalm 103, showing that God is both "kind and merciful."

Sunday's Communion hymn is *Yes, I Shall Arise*, written by Fr. Lucien Deiss, its title drawn from the prodigal son's decision in Luke 15:18, a companion story to the Gospel's unforgiving servant, showing God's unearned mercy.

Sunday's Communion meditation is *There's a Wideness in God's Mercy*, with a text by Frederick William Faber, and a new choral composition by Karen Marroli. The selection shows God's mercy in that "there is welcome for the sinner."

Sunday's Final hymn is *The Kingdom of God*. In his text, Bryn Rees underscores God's expansive mercy: "the captives are freed, the sinners find place."

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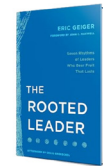
